COUNCIL MINUTES

February 21, 2012

The St. Olaf Church Council met at 7:00 p.m. on February 21st. President Virgil Tindall welcomed the new members: Carolyn Melde (Deacon), Larry Simmons (Trustee), and Teresa Christiansen (Education).

After devotion and praver by Pastor Joan, Gerald Nelson gave the treasurer's report: Year-to-date income over expenses is \$5,944.59, thanks to one gift of \$5,000. The yard sale netted \$680.75 and will be used for tables and chairs for the basement. Rock Church Fund stands at \$70,298.03 and Niki Covers the Cold has accounts of \$2,124.95 in checking and \$6,669.04 in a CD.

Pastor Joan has been busy, netting 914 miles for the month of January, and spending 60 hours per week in visits, office hours, services, etc. She was commended for her care of our parish, and urged to try to curtail her commitments when possible to avoid burnout on her part.

Attendance at the Biker's Services has been small, and the deacons are considering changing the time to Saturday afternoons when the weather is warmer.

Trustees have a multitude of concerns, among them lighting near the outside kitchen entrance. A motion detector light was suggested to be placed near the northeast corner of the roof to make it safer. It was hoped that the stained glass windows would be installed in March.

Doland Olson reported that the cemetery has a balance of \$15,605.29. He urged everyone to attend the annual meeting at the Rock Church on April 7th at 11:00 a.m. It was noted that the port-o-potties are not being cleaned by the supplier as needed.

Under Old Business the following decisions were made: One-half of offerings at Lenten services, Maundy

Thursday and Good Friday will be designated to DiscipleLife Alive! Campaign.

Guy Finstad will be the Stewardship chairperson, but may not be available to work on this project until after the completion of the Gathering Place.

Benevolences will be paid semi-annually.

Probably completion of the Gathering Place at the Rock Church will be July or August.

Confirmation students will sell T-shirts and bumper stickers with our new church logo.

Under New Business concerns were raised about the balcony railing, a kitchen door light, and possibility of more power in the basement area. Three upcoming weddings at the Rock Church were approved.

The meeting concluded with The Lord's Prayer.



Holy Week

It is the week that changed everything! (Also called the Passion Narrative) It's not like we shouldn't have seen it coming. In the first three Gospels, Jesus warns his followers that he must go up to Jerusalem to "undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders... and be killed, and after three days rise again" (Mark 8:31). It may look like God is not in control, but God is working through all the events of this week!

It starts with the triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Jesus is at the height of his career as the people throw palm branches and their cloaks on the road before him. He creates a big stir in the city! The crowd is supporting him with shouts of "Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna in the high-est!" (Matthew 21.9). On Palm Sunday we begin our service with the joyful waving of palms, too, but then we also hear "rest of the story" with a dramatic reading and songs telling of Jesus' last days, followed by Holy Communion. Join us on April 1 at St. Olaf at 9:45am.

Jesus spends the week teaching in parables, answering questions and visiting with his dearest friends and disciples! He prepares to say his final good-byes. During a meal with the disciples, Jesus blesses and breaks bread, and says to them, "Take, eat; this is my body." Then he gives them wine saying, "This is my blood of the covenant, which is poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins." (Matthew 26:26-28) He gives us an example of what we need to do—wash one another's feet! He's showing us how to be humble servants. You will have the opportunity to experience this in our Maundy Thursday service at St. Olaf at 6:00pm April 5. The service ends with the stripping of the altar and silence.

Good Friday is the day that we all would rather skip—what is good about it? It is painful to remember the suffering of our Lord, but obedience sometimes leads to suffering. Jesus pays the price for following God's commands with a horrible death on a cross. Yet, if the cross remained empty that Friday afternoon, where would our salvation come from? What is good about this Friday is that it is God's Friday, where God's will was done for the salvation of the world. We worship on April 6 at 7:00pm as the sun sets at the Rock Church with a solemn service based on the seven last words of Jesus.

Early Easter morning as the sun rises we welcome the first light of Resurrection Day at the Rock Church at 7:00am. Please join us for a simple service of joyful praise to our Lord. According to Matthew, early on the first day of the week, Mary Magdalene and Mary, the mother of James and Joseph, went to the tomb. An angel informed the women that Jesus had risen and they should go and tell! Then you're welcome to join us for breakfast at St. Olaf after the service.

Later at 9:45am at St. Olaf, we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord with traditional Lutheran worship! We give thanks to the Lord that day for continuing to be present in our lives. We remember our baptism and share in the Holy Meal! You're all welcome to renew your faith and remember why we're Christians! It can change your life!
