## THE GATHERING PLACE



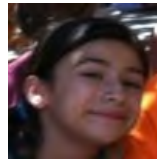
The Gathering Place at the Rock Church is beginning to take shape. Thanks to all those who are making this possible. Go by and take a look!

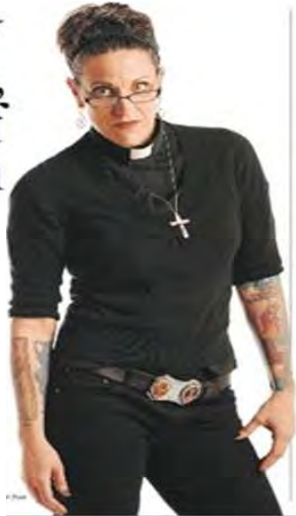

## Taking a Holy Rest

Throughout most the month of July we heard from Mark chapter six in our gospel reading on Sundays. I like Mark's writing—he's always to the point and has some good stories as well. One thing that I have noticed in this chapter is that Jesus gives us a pattern for living the Christian life. It is a pattern that I, and maybe you, can benefit from.

Mark 6 begins with work—Jesus teaches in his hometown of Nazareth and is rejected. He notes that “prophets are not without honor except in their hometown, and among their own kin and own house.” Work can have its challenges, can't it? Then he sends his disciples (ones taught), and they become also apostles (ones sent) going out two by two to the surrounding villages sharing the message of repentance (change or turning around). They are told to travel light—only a staff and sandals for extras as they are working for the kingdom of God.

They have a successful mission trip, and they begin to reflect with the Lord about it. Suddenly in the middle of their reflection, Mark interrupts with the account of John the Baptist's death—a gruesome reminder of what can happen to those working for the kingdom. But the disciples/apostles continue to gather faithfully around Jesus and share stories in spite of that report. (I find this to be incredibly good news! And Christians continue to gather and share around the body and blood of Christ to this very day.)

After that time of reflection, Jesus says to his closest followers, “Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest for a while.” Jesus commands a time of rest—leaving the crowds behind and the demands of preaching, teaching, and healing. The crowds will always be there, but you have to make time for rest. I call it a holy rest.

In fact in a portion of the chapter that we do not read on Sundays, Mark tells of the feeding of 5000 people—talk about work preempting a break! People will not leave Jesus and the disciples/ apostles alone. Finally we hear that Jesus “made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side... while *he* dismissed the crowd.” Jesus is demanding that rest time for his disciples. He personally will take over while they leave.

So there is the pattern for the Christian life—work, reflection, rest. Work for the kingdom of God, take time to reflect with other Christians and then have a holy rest. On that note, Steve and I are going to take some time to go to the mountains the middle of this month for a little break. I hope that you also are finding time to get “away to a deserted place and rest for a while.” Work, even the Lord's work, will be there when you come back. And if you visit a church building while away don't forget to take a photo to share with us. We are still the church of Jesus Christ even when we travel. (Inspired by Pr.
