

# Family Spotlight



#### he Peder A. and Otto Nygaard Families

Peder Ole Nygaard was born 1842 in Norway and grew up in the Oslo area. In 1884 he married Ingeborg Oldsdatter Melheim. She had two brothers who came to America and became involved in the restaurant business in Chicago. In 1885 Peder, Ingeborg and baby daughter came to America.

They moved to Bosque County a year later. Seven children were born to Peder and Ingeborg: Mattie (1885-1960), Carrie (1888-1910), Katie (1890 – 1971), Inger (1892 – 1923), Ole (1893 – 1899), Otto (1896 – 19?), and Annie (1897 – 1906).

Otto was born at Norse and was baptized, confirmed and married by Rev. J.K. Rystad. He received his education at the Norse School, where he met Hannah Caroline Olson to whom he was married in 1917. They made their first home in the Neils Creek community and later bought a farm in the Mustang community. Otto and Hannah had four children.

Myrtice Irene was born in 1921. She married Curtis Larson from Clifton in 1948. They both attended Clifton Junior College and North Texas State College. Myrtice taught school in several areas and also taught at North Texas. She and Curtis moved to Arlington in 1953, where both were teacher/Administrators in public education. Their combined years of teaching service totaled 74 years, Curtis had 34 years and Myrtice taught 40 years. The Myrtice and Curtis Larson Elementary School in Grand Prairie was named in their honor.

A daughter was born to Otto and Hannah who died in infancy in 1924. Prentice Mourine is buried in the Rock Church Cemetery.

In 1926 twins were born, Hazel Norene and Olney Noran. They were confirmed in St. Olaf Church in 1941 by Pastor Walter Maakestad. Norene attended North Texas State College and also taught school, completing 38 years upon retirement in 1984. Noran served in the Pacific Islands during World War II. When he returned he attended Texas A&M and North Texas. He was employed in geophysics and civil engineering. Noran was buried in the Rock Church Cemetery on February 24, 2016.

Myrtice continues to live in the Arlington area involved in school and community activities which she has loved all her life. We are blessed to have her continuing interest and support in the churches and school where she grew up. Thank you for families, such as this, who have contributed to the life of St. Olaf for many years. ~Geneva Finstad

Just a short blurb this month as I say my goodbyes to those of you at St. Olaf on May 1:

Phyllis Rieser, President of the Council, asked me to write what I am most proud of in our ministry together at St. Olaf. You probably know the many of the community related events – you may not know about things in worship, and worship is the major thing that a congregation does that sets it apart from other organizations. So these are some of my favorite worship memories at St. Olaf.



I was so happy to see a total of five young people confirmed, with a large supportive congregation attending worship. We baptized 17 in worship during my time here, and they included children and adults. We received a total of 39 new members! We lost 24 members in death and also buried about 20 of our friends and family around St. Olaf. Though they are sad times, each of those burial services is special to me as we care for the family.

We had special worship events that I won't forget – bell choir, harpist, missionary speaker, and guest pastors who taught us more about Ebola and the NTNL Prison Ministry. St. Olaf opened their hearts to them with generous offerings! And then there were the joint services with Faith Lutheran Church each Pentecost Sunday. Once it even ended with a picnic in the park! There have been plenty of good times that I won't forget. And I certainly won't forget you all!


